

“‘Come Out of Her My People’ – Pastor Stephen Bohr” posted 12/31/19 by Aaron.

Pastor Bohr says, “the Bible says” so I believe it safe to assume that “the Bible” he refers to is the New King James Version (NKJV) since that is “the Bible” he uses almost exclusively.

Around 10:23 he says to be careful about what we eat and drink. He says, “You need to have a healthy body to have a healthy mind.” I presume that would apply to spiritual food and also to temporal food.

Around 10:58 he says, “You see most Christians believe that the judgment is going to take place when Jesus comes or perhaps even at the moment you die. Because they believe that when a person dies, ah, if the person was evil they go to hell or their soul goes to hell.” His NKJV supports the doctrine of immediate punishment at death.

“then the Lord knows how to deliver the godly out of temptations and to reserve the unjust under punishment for the day of judgment.” 2 Peter 2:9 (NKJV).

Being “under punishment” means the person is being punished at death while awaiting the judgment. The Protestant Bible words it a bit differently.

“The Lord knoweth how to deliver the godly out of temptations, and to reserve the unjust unto the day of judgment to be punished:” 2 Peter 2:9 from the King James Version (KJV).

The King James Bible clearly teaches that the unjust won’t be punished until the judgment day comes.

Around 11:21 he says, “And some even say that for people who have not reached the age of accountability their soul would go to limbo.” What he is describing is the Roman Catholic doctrine of original sin. That doctrine is also supported by his favorite bible.

“Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin my mother conceived me.” Psalms 51:5 (NKJV).

“Behold, I was shapen in iniquity; and in sin did my mother conceive me.” Psalms 51:5 (KJV).

The King James Bible in saying “shapen in iniquity” means the child is born with a sinful nature (that does NOT mean the child had already sinned) just like any other human being that was born including Christ. It does NOT mean the child had already sinned before being born. The NKJV in saying, “brought forth in iniquity” could mean the child had sinned even before being born. Maybe that isn’t clear enough. The NKJV is a gateway bible that changes words and prepares you to receive something worse. To make this a bit more clear, here is that verse from the New International Version (NIV) as taken from responsive reading 756 in the *Seventh-day Adventist Hymnal*.

“Surely I have been a sinner from birth, sinful from the time my mother conceived me.” Psalms 51:5 (NIV).

Conception occurs at the time the sperm joins the egg. The NIV is saying the child has already committed sin before it had a brain.

The doctrine of original sin is used to support the Roman Catholic dogma of the sinless state of Mary and the doctrine of limbo. Limbo is where a child that dies without being baptized supposedly goes.
