Dear Brother Duncan, Around 27:33 you say how the New King James Version (NKJV) is better than the King James Version (hereafter to be called the King James Bible) in 1 Corinthians 1:18 because, according to you, it goes along better with what the Greek says. Let me ask you a few questions:

1. Do you have an infallible Bible? Shortly after saying you like what the NKJV says, you start talking about future tense so I presume you know the difference between singular and pleural. I said infallible Bible (singular) and not infallible bibles (pleural). You must also be aware that the English definition for infallible has not been different over hundreds of years; it means NO ERROR AT ALL. The Lord's messengers says:

"He who has a knowledge of God and His word through personal experience has a settled faith in the divinity of the Holy Scriptures. He has proved that God's word is truth and he knows that truth can never contradict itself." *The Ministry of Healing* page 462.

"The Bible, and the Bible alone, is to be our creed, the sole bond of union; all who bow to this Holy Word will be in harmony, Our own views and ideas must not control our efforts. Man is fallible but God's Word is infallible." *Selected Messages Book One* page 416.

Notice that she said the "Bible" (singular) and that it's infallible. To be credible you need to pick one in ENGLISH since you're speaking in English to an English speaking audience. If you refer to the Greek you are no different than Roman Catholic clergy who claim that only they, with their knowledge of Latin, Greek, Hebrew and the traditions of the church are qualified to interpret the true meaning of Scripture.

2. Here are some more verses from the NKJV. Considering the proper uses of future and past tenses and singular and pleural see how you like them.

Ezekiel 28:18 from the NKJV - "You defiled your sanctuaries By the multitude of your iniquities, By the iniquity of your trading; Therefore I brought fire from your midst; It devoured you, And I turned you to ashes upon the earth In the sight of all who saw you."

This verse is talking about Lucifer who became Satan and it says he was turned (past tense) to ashes. If true, Satan is dead. Is this "Bible" infallible?

Revelation 22:2 from the NKJV - "In the middle of its street, and on either side of the river, was the tree of life, which bore twelve fruits, each tree yielding its fruit every month. The leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations."

Notice it says "each tree" which means there has to be more than one tree. Is there more than one tree of life? It's a simple singular or pleural question.

3. Notice what your NKJV says in Zechariah.

Zechariah 13:6 from the NKJV - "And one will say to him, 'What are these wounds between your arms?' Then he will answer, 'Those with which I was wounded in the house of my friends.'"

Tell me brother, were the wounds between the "arms" or in the "hands" as the King James Bible says? Be careful how you answer because on page 226 of The Acts of the Apostles you will find that Sister White says this verse is a messianic prophecy. If she was wrong it would make her a false prophet wouldn't it? If you have an Andrews Study Bible (they come in the NKJV, New International Version, the Almeida Revista e Atualizada and the Reina-Valera 95 versions) you will find a footnote that blasphemously says the wounds were acquired during idolatrous rituals.

In short, when they pretend all bibles are the same and use a corrupt version and say "the Bible says," they are liars.

3. "Error is never harmless. It never sanctifies, but always brings confusion and dissension. It is always dangerous. The enemy has great power over minds that are not thoroughly fortified by prayer and established in Bible truth." Testimony for the Church volume 5 page 292.
